Dear Ms. Kendrick,

I am writing to request a response to my letter of March 16 regarding Dreamworks Animation's panda bear martial arts project, known at various times as "Kung Fu Panda" and "Ninja Panda." I would like to know your company's position on the panda-martial arts idea that Lance Young pilfered from me and exactly how far it has developed it into a feature animated film. It has been over a month since I sent the information you said you needed in order to respond to my claim, and two months since your letter that represented, "I will respond further, after I have been able to assemble all of the facts regarding this matter."

You have had more than enough time to investigate this matter. Your delays lead me to believe that you have confirmed the theft and are attempting to cover it up. Therefore, I would appreciate an immediate written response to my claim. In it, please provide me with information regarding the current status of the panda project, including the anticipated release date plus the addresses of the Dreamworks SKG principals (who I made aware of this theft prior to the spin-off of Dreamworks Animation SKG, Inc.), the Dreamworks Animation executive(s) in charge of production, the producers, the alleged "creator" of the panda-doing-martial arts idea, the alleged designer of the panda character, the current director, all past directors associated with the project, and all writers working on the screenplay—past and present. This will make my service of the complaints or subpoenas to these individuals more efficient when the time comes.
